Sunday August 30th was an important occasion in the lives of eight of the dogs from the Geelong German Shepherd Club, when they were presented with their Award Medals by Councillor Purnell.

The presentation of a medal as the Club's token of recognition to dogs qualifying for the certificate of Companion Dog is the first of its kind in our Club, brought into vogue by Miss McCormack, and it was fitting that the first group of winners should receive them.

Councillor Purnell, on presenting the awards, congratulated the Club on the fine work it is doing in the Geelong District, in striving to restore the "Shepherd's" good name by making this Obedience Training available to German Shepherd owners. He also expressed his thanks for the many demonstrations given by the Club for Charity Organizations in the district.

A series of exercises was displayed by the dogs to demonstrate to Mr. Purnell the type of work required to qualify for the title of "C.D." & "C.D.X.", which requires a pass of 85 points for C.D. and 220 for C.D.X. under three different Judges.

#### = NEWS OF DOGS FROM OVERSEAS =

Shepherd appointed a "Railway Policeman - For Life"

In Hannover, Germany "Briske" of Richmond Castle" has won so many medals that she would vanish from sight if they were worn all at once.

Since 1957, she has been accorded the title "City Champion of Hannover", won the contest for service dogs of the railway police of the Federal Republic of Germany, came out first at two contests on a national scale at Duisburg and in Munich in 1958.

As the most successful of all German shepherd dogs the intelligent and fine-looking animal has now been appointed "Railway Policeman" for life to ensure that she wont change owners in her old age.

The man under whose special charge the dog is placed is an employee of the German Federal Railways, Herr Guhne of the Railway Police Station in Hannover.

# = WHAT AILS YOUR DOG ? =

This month we deal with one of the most common killers of dogs -

#### DISTEMPER

Distemper is EXTREMELY contagious to other dogs. Any puppy coughing showing any discharge from the eyes or nose, or appearing to be below normal by refusing food or by drinking excessively should be suspected.

If in doubt about your puppy - you should consult a qualified Vet with-out delay.

Inoculation with virus and serum properly used, can give virtually a lif -time of immunity from the disease.

We recommend that ALL MEMBERS dogs' inoculation be undertaken as early as possible after 3 months of age.

On no account exercise your dog if he is suffering from distemper.

# = FROTECT YOUR DOG FROM POISONERS =

We hope that there are no people so inhumane where we live - but this article taken from "PIX" may help you to teach your dog to protect himself.

"Provide the dog with special feeding facilities, consisting of a fixed drinking trough and feed dish. Never allow him to have his food anywhere else but these places.

Then have some friends who are NOT known to the dog give him pieces of meat lightly covered in papper or bitter aloes. Also leave choice morsels lying on the ground in the yard covered in the same type of thing.

He will soon learn that the only food that he can rely on is that given to him by the family in his special dish.

The same bitter aloes can be left in old tins of water, etc., to teach him to drink only from his special dish."

These methods can be varied in different ways - but the result is the same - you may save your dog's life.

# = TRIAL RULES = (No. 25)

We take this opportunity of advising our Members - new to Obedience Trials - that bitches "On Season" can not compete, and will be disqualified by the Vet.

If the missortune arises before or after "Vetting" lock your bitch up in your car <a href="MMEDIATELY">IMMEDIATELY</a> to prevent any dogs being upset and so losing points in the sing.

Above all do not walk any bitch over the rings before any trial commences, we want everyone to get and give a sporting chance of their fellow contestents.

It is a good idea to have a bottle of "Anti Mate" on hand - just in case.

At Shows and Open Parades, bit has on season are eligible to compete, or the Judge's discretion.\*\*\*
