Well the 1984/1985 Club year has ended and been a somewhat turbulent one (from outside and inside forces), (as the Presidents report set out elswhere relates).

The major Club project for the year, apart from the obvious one of rebuilding, was to make the change to become an Incorporated Body, and after many hours of work by the Committee especially the Special Projects Officer, Lesley Gaylard; as at 27th June we have now become a legally incorporated body. The new Constitution will come into effect from this date and it is currently in the hands of the printers and will be available to the members shortly for a nominal fee , as was the old one.

The interest shown in our elections this year was proven when voters had to actually eliminate names from the list of those standing for Committee selection.

To all those members who stood but did not make it this year, thank you for your interest in the Club and we hope to see you fill some of the sub-committee teams, and then try again next year for full committee vacancies.

It is always with regret that we see someone stand down from Committee after having put such an effort into the Club over the years, but we do understand that everyone need a break from continual club committments, and this time standing down is Bruce our 1984/1985 President.

Bruce thank you for your efforts over the year and for coping with the additional task of being Training Supervisor at the same time.

To all those Committee members who served the club over this year, thank you from all of us, for without your quidance and support the Club cannot function.

To the newly elected committee we wish you well and we make special welcome to our new Club President, Graham Douglas.

The 2nd July was a momentous occasion for Graham, as he was not only officially declared President for the 1985/86 year but he was also awarded a Life Membership to the Club for his contributions to the Club over a period of years. It was Graham's efforts that contributed in a great way to making the grounds come up to

the standard they are kept in today. Congratulation on both counts Graham!

Not to be left off this front page is Phyl Bergin who was also awarded a Life membership at that same meeting.

Might I add here that neither recipient knew of their awards prior to the presentation so it was a great surprise and joy to them both.

Phyl as members know, is a "jill of all trades" in our club. Phyl trained her unregistered dog "Cindy" through C.D. and C.D.X. back in the days when unregistered dogs competed with registered dogs, but were not allowed to hold those titles and their scores were not recognized in any way. When the K.C.C. decided unregistered dogs could compete separately and hold similar (but not the same) titles to those of registered dogs, Phyl and Cindy went on together to obtain G.D., G.D.X. and P.D.X.

Phyl being a retired Librarian was the instigator of the Club Library being set up and this proved to be a first in Obedience Clubs. Phyl not only set up our library; but services it, writes for it, operates it and provides assistance to members seeking the right book for their specific problems or areas of interest.

She has been and still is a dedicated Committee member and singularly conducts the highest training classes in the Club. Her vast experience gained in training her own dog, and those of others, is a valuable asset to this Club. Well done Phyl!

EXTRA SPECIAL

On a more sombre note now, the future format of this Newsletter may have to change for ensuing newsletters.

PRESIDENTS ANNUAL REPORT 1985

1984/85 year has been an eventful and memorable year, which I will outline as follows:

In July the Clubhouse was burgled twice within 48 hours with the value of property stolen being approx. \$4,000.

July also saw the foundation of this club to become an incorporated body and a sub committee formed to do the behind the scenes work. In September it was voted on by members that the club goes ahead to become incorporated. This club officially became an incorporated body on June 24th 1985.

In October, some of the property which was stolen was recovered by the police which meant more identification and paperwork for the committee.

The clubs 30th Anniversary Year Trial which was to be held on a Sunday in December was changed to a Saturday for the first time ever for this club, with a Dinner Dance being held in the clubrooms afterwards to celebrate the 30th Anniversary.

On December 14th a mini tornado passed over and through Geelong with this clubhouse being in its path. The roof trusses were bent and the roof carried across the road, and brick walls and internal fittings being damaged. Being right on the festive and holiday season it was a slow and frustrating time to get insurance people and builders organised. At this point I must thank members for arranging, transport, storage and physical help during this crisis.

During this time we were unable to use the clubhouse and evening meetings were held at the showgrounds.

In March the building was started to be rebuilt and was almost completed for our trial held in late April.

In May, members interested in German Shepherd showing started show training at these grounds and a meeting about breed affairs was held in June.

During this year the Display team has been training and has attended different venues whenever requested, and putting on excellent displays.

Instructors have again put in alot of time helping members and imparting knowledge to the many people who come here to learn how to train their dogs.

The number of dogs which attended these grounds for training in the last 12 months is 5,000 which is an average of 122 per training session.

Once again, as with last year there were three (3) Open obedience trials held successfully at these grounds with 150/200 entries per trial.

In closing my sincere thanks are extended to all committee members, Instructors, Display team and all other members who have volunteered their help in one way or another - your help is deeply appreciated, and your continued support will mean that the Geelong German Shepherd and Obedience Dog Club Inc. will prosper for years to come.

Finally may I conclude by thanking you for the opportunity and priviledge to be your President during 1984/85.


THE MONEY HUNGRY DOG

THERE'S no stopping Bess now that she has her wheels.

Just one year ago this friendly 11-year-old german shepherd was under threat of being put down after she developed an illness which eventually causes paralysis in the dog's back legs.

But now she is running around like a two-year-old dog, since her owners, Jim and Liz Grant, of Perth, obtained a canine wheelchair from the U.S.

It is the first of its kind in Australia. When using her wheels, Bess, pictured above with her mistress, forgets there is anything wrong with her.

She was diagnosed as having the motor neurone disease during a routine visit to the vet about a year ago. Liz happened to mention that Bess was dragging her leg a little.

"I thought she was just getting old and lazy," says Liz.

The disease is somewhat like multiple sclerosis in that it is an illness which slowly worsens.

"As the dogs get worse, generally the only choice is to have them put down. Otherwise they must lead a miserable existence, unable to move, and I consider that a cruel fate," says Liz.

Fortunately for Bess, an alternative was discovered. Liz rose unusually early one morning and decided to watch the American show You Asked For It. A vet, Dr Lincoln Parks, was discussing a wheelchair he'd designed

for disabled german shepherds. Liz could hardly control her excitement.

At first, they acted with caution and asked their local vet about the idea. He was suitably impressed. After some diligent research Dr Parks was contacted.

"I was on the telephone to Dr Parks in Pennsylvania while Liz was measuring Bess to get the statistics needed to build the chair," Jim says.

"Though it looks very simple, the chair's design is quite ingenious and each one has to be custom made to suit the particular dog. Any alteration in

its specifications would mean an imbalance of weight and the dog would be most uncomfortable."


Dr Parks wanted assurance that Bess had a sound heart. Once he got that, the chair was made within 24 hours and air freighted to Bess as a late Christmas present.

The cart costs \$250.

"People probably think we are weird," says Liz. "But we are concerned for Bess' quality of life.

"When the chair arrived, it had to be finely tuned to suit Bess perfectly. But once that was done, she took to it like a duck to water.

"We want other german shepherd number and help in any other way,' on (09) 387 4491.



FUN DAYS

Each year our Club has what are known as "Fun Days". These are either inter club days, or our own strictly members days.

In September this year we actually have two such "Fun Days" and we hope that as many members as possible participate.

These days are for everyone and even if you have only been training for a few WEEKS there is still a class for you.

There is no formal training held on these days other than a short warm up with your normal Instructor prior to commencement of the activities. Your trainer will tell you what class you should enter in a week prior to the event. You do have to pay an entry fee of \$1.00, which goes towards the costs of ribbons and incidentals for the day.

Classes are over by lunch time and then competitors and friends can stay and have a BBQ lunch (members can use the Club BBQ, or bring their own) or a picnic lunch. After lunch the presentations are made and if you are placed in any class you not only get a ribbon from Geelong, but you also get one from each other club competing. It is as it says a "Fun Day", you are just competing with other members of a similar standard and it doesn't count towards gaining any Obedience Titles.

Fortunately this year we are the host Club in both instances and this means the "Fun Days" will be held at our grounds.

The first day to remember is 8TH SEPTEMBER which is Geelong -v- Bendigo and entries will close on 1st September (a week before) for this one. The second is 29TH SEPTEMBER and this is between Geelong, Altona and Werribee.

Following is a list of the classes that will be held on these days, and on the back of this Newsletter is an entry sheet that will see members through each day. Points are awarded to each Club up to Class 9. At the end of the day the Club with the highest points wins a Perpetual Trophy/Shield which they maintain until the following year's "Fun Day". So the more members we enter the better chance we have of earning this award. In the 3-way "Fun Day" the Club with the highest score is awarded a wooden spoon and we really would like to pass this on to one of the other Clubs this year.


