- *Armstrong W.H. SOUNDER: a story of racial prejudice, and the courage and determination of a young negro boy and his bulldog X hound.
- *Atkinson E. GREYFRIARS BOBBY: a true story of a Skye terrier, who, for 14 years returned to spend every night at his shepherd master's grave in Greyfriars church yard Edinburgh Tand you have other cominatteeouse.

Burnford Sheila (1) BEL RIA, DOG OF WAR: - an authentic war story of the loyalty of a small terrier: his survival during the horrors of World War II, including the evacuation of Dunkirk, and the London blitz.

OUR JULY 6TH TRIAL

To enter, members must have registered their purebreed dog with the K.C.C. and be a currentfinancial member or be on the Associate register, again being a currently financial member. If you don't understand this, please ask your Instructor or one of the Committee members.

Members with short coated dogs can enter the trial with their dog coated providing the coat is left on for the duration of the trial. So try it members, and don't hibernate with your dog just because it's cold and wet this time. Remember both we and our dogs should be able to work together as a team in all kinds of weather.

There will be WORKING BEES prior to this trial. The dates to remember are JUNE 21ST and JULY 5TH.

IF YOU PUT YOUR NAME DOWN AS BEING AVAILABLE FOR STEWARDING AT OUR CLUB TRIALS, PLEASE NOTIFY THE TRIAL SECRETARY B E F O R E the day if you find you have other committments. Failing to notify your intentions of this leaves the Trial Secretary trying to perform a juggling act at the last minute, all of which could be avoided if common courtesy was applied.

Similarly if you commit yourself to a WORKING BEE or to help in the kitchen the same courtesies should be extended.

BELIEVE IT OR NOT

Seems an enterprising male Jack Russell Terrier was enamoured of a Great Dane bitch. Like they say if at first you don't succeed try, try again and HE DID. There is now a litter of JACK'S GREATS or RUS TE DANES.

THE PADDOCK

This paddock is not a part of our leasehold it is under direct control of the Shire so don't abuse this privilege by letting your dogs run willy nilly all over the place. If you aren't able to do the recall, i.e. have your dog return to you when you call it PLEASE keep your dog on the lead. Dogs playing or running free don't always watch their owners and other people and with the amount of dogs using this area prior to training, it wouldn't take much to have children or adults bowled over in the twinkling of an eye. Apart from that, dogs running freely together constitute a pack, and their social attitude changes. The well mannered dog at home can change personalities when running in a pack where there will be a leader calling the shots (other than yourself who is, or should be, the pack leader on all other occasions).

DOGS are not to be tied to the veranda after training. If you wantto come into the Clubrooms, please put them into, or tie them up beside, your car. This rule applies for two reasons, one the dogs can get themselves tangled up very quickly and it is best to avoid unnecessary stress, and secondly some dogs can't seem to keep their mouths shut when they are tied up there. This makes it very difficult for the President to be heard when making announcements as at times there is a cacophony within to contend with without extra's externally.

BOTTLE "O"

Don't give them to the local collector give them to us as the Club collects same and gains a small cash return for them. Aluminium cans are welcome too. Members may leave these in the holding pen which is situated in the corner directly opposite to the main entrance gate. These can be deposited there at any time as despite its looks the front gate is NOT padlocked but we like it closed when we are not in official attendance. Please remember that.

NEXT issue of this Newsletter will be the last training day in JULY. If members are not in attendance on that day, their respective trainers should have a copy kept aside for you.
