SALLY THE COMPANION DOG

Early in December, 1990 I was contacted by the Matron of Pineville Nursing Home, who was interested in the possibility of the nursing home obtaining a live-in four legged companion. I visited the nursing home and knew immediately that this was the perfect place for a companion dog. There are 28 permanent patients at the home, some are fully incapacitated but most are reasonably mobile and alert, and the nursing and domestic staff are all very special people.

Our Club once again decided that we should donate a dog to the home when a suitable one was found.

This was the start of several visits to the Geelong Animal Welfare Society to find the right dog. There were, of course, dozens just begging to be taken, but both Matron Robertson and I knew we had to let our heads rule our hearts.

Finally we came across a sad looking black and white pointer/labrador cross bitch, who put her paw up to be shaken and licked our hands and we knew she was the one. She needed a minor operation to remove a lump and a check by the Vet, who told us she was seven or eight years old, and she was ready to go to her new home.

So it was that on the 2nd February, Matron Robertson, Stuart Innes and myself escorted this so-far un-named dog to the nursing home. We arrived at lunchtime so she was immediately tempted with some tit-bits and then given a tour of inspection. The matron had been running a competition where all the patients had written a name for their new companion on a piece of paper, and we watched with interest as the name was drawn out. Out came "SALLY", so Sally she is, although it has now been shortened more often than not to "OUR SAL".

She has proven to be the perfect companion to these 228 ladies and the staff, and is loved by them all. She has given them a reason to live and the matron tells me that even those patients who were previously uncommunicative and withdrawn now respond as soon as Sally appears.

She certainly has settled in well, and we hope that she will live a long and pampered life, doing what she was obviously born to do!

When I visited the nursing home last week I sat on the floor with Sally sitting in front of me. As I stroked her and talked to her she put a paw on each of my shoulders and gave me a big lick. She seemed to be saying "Thank you Geelong Obedience Dog Club".

ROTIWEILER ROAD TEST

HISTORY

The Rottweiler is descended from ancient herding/guard dogs. His origin stems from Roman times, when he performed the duty of guard and drover dog.

When the Romans crossed the alps their dogs accompanied them, protecting the herds which travelled with the troops as meat on the hoof. In the area of Rottweil in Germany the Roman army dogs came into contact with the local dogs native to the area.

Interbreeding between these working dogs produced the dog we now know as the Rottweil Butchers Dog - The Rottweiler.

This sturdy black and tan dog, bred to be vigorous, powerful, intelligent and able to work independently, was a capable and much sought after companion guard and draught dog.

The Rottweiler is a strong willed individual with a definite mind of its own. His appearance proclaims his function as a companion dog of great strength of character and strength, ideal for its past function as a herding cattle dog and guard, and for pulling carts. In 1910 the Rottweiler was officially recognized as a Police Dog.

POPULARITY

Today the Rottweiler's sterling character has gained him immense popularity as a family companion protector. The ancient use of this immensely strong dog as a draught animal is restricted to gala events. The Rottweiler loves to be the centre of interest and thoroughly enjoys his task of carting. The Rottweiler is also an efficient tracking dog and reliable competition obedience and agility dog.

APPEARANCE

Medium large robust dog, with coarse black coat and clearly defined tan markings. His compact powerful build radiates great strength, manoeuvrability and endurance. Size 57cm to 68cm. Bitches ideally 60-61cm, (23" to 25") dogs 65-66cm (25" to 27" at shoulder).

CHARACTER

He is self reliant with strong nerves and fearless character. Very aware, and keenly alert to his surroundings. Of calm demeanour he is friendly by nature and generally loves children, is affectionate and willing to please. Keen and quick to learn, devoted to their family and reserved with strangers.

TRAINING

As with all working breeds the Rottweiler needs firm guidance and training. It is of **vital** importance that a thorough early socializing be carried out. Exposure to all the normal everyday events is necessary for the puppy, in a non stressful atmosphere. This is essential if the dog is to be expected to fit the right action to the right situation when mature.

It cannot be stressed the importance of this early grounding. Early exper-Cont...

-iences are never forgotten and the puppy owner should be very aware of this.

Never rough play or wrestle with your Rottweiler. From the very start you must be the pack leader, firm fair and in command. The dog must learn to respect you and know his place in your family.







ATTENTION TRIALLING FRATERNITY

NOTICE OF MOTION

It is hereby moved that an amendment be made to By-Law No. 2 (d) of the Rules of Geelong Obedience Dog Club, Incorporated, regarding the Awarding of Life Memberships, to read as follows:-

"Any person, after a period of five (5) years continuous membership may be appointed as a Life Member of the Club in recognition of services rendered to the Club, however under exceptional circumstances the five (5) year period may be waived. Not more than two persons may be appointed as Life Members of the Club in any one financial year.

The appointment of Life Members, on the receipt of nominations, shall be decided by a sub-committee consisting of all current Life Members who have actively attended the Club during the previous 24 months. At the Committee Meeting held in July in each year the Committee shall nominate a person from these current Life Members to be the Chairperson of such sub-committee. The Chairperson need not be a current committee member.

Any nominations must be made in writing and handed to the Chairperson at least seven (7) days prior to the Annual General Meeting, at which time the Chairperson shall call a meeting of the sub-committee to decide on the appointment of Life Membership. A vote will be taken and 75% majority in favour shall be the deciding factor as to whether any such Life Memberships shall be awarded.

At the Annual General Meeting the awarding of any Life Memberships shall be presented by the Chairperson of the sub-committee."

PLEASE NOTE: THE NOTICE OF MOTION WILL BE VOTED ON AT THE GENERAL MEETING 4th of JUNE 1991.
