A warm welcome is extended to all new members and may your time spent with us be fulfilling in not only what you achieve together with your dog, but in the friendships forged through a common interest.

Remember the club is essentially a school for handlers and you the handler teach the dog(s). But like they say, "all work and no play makes Jack a dull boy" so we hold Fun Days at varying intervals throughout the year - some solely for our members, and others are combined with other clubs. Hence our recent "Spirit of the West" two-way fun day, the result of which to all intents had Werribee winning the shield. However, due to an administrative error on our behalf those figures proved inaccurate. Our thanks are extended to the Werribee Club for later advising of our mistake. They may have lost by ONE point in the final analysis, but they certainly deserve bonus points for their honesty.

Our "other play" comes in the form of Social Events and the recent Trivia Night was an outstanding success and thanks go to our Social Co-Ordinator and her team of willing workers for organising this function. Your continued support at these functions make for a more cohesive club. So hope to see you at the next event.

New rules have been passed by the V.C.A. permitting registered and associate dogs to compete in the same rings together at trials. This is something clubs have been trying to promote for many years, as to achieve success, the same time is put into the training of a dog whether it is registered or unregistered and they do exactly the same exercises in practice and competition. Obedience has been a form of racial discrimination up to this time. One of our travelling members has been trialling in New South Wales and they not only have been having joint rings but the classes have had dogs and bitches competing together. This has always been another grey area with the controlling bodies. The latter mix should not present problems at a trial really as we all train in mixed classes normally and certainly for those dogs who are a bit lack lustre this might just be the incentive needed for them to lift their game. through on this theme, ALL dogs now are awarded the same titles for the same work instead of separate nomenclatures.

Our trial in July will see our club offering all competitors equal competing rights in rings, which should be interesting as there are some judges in the scheme at present who have stated they are not interested in judging associate classes. Clubs in general need obviously to be promoting not only responsible ownership, but equal rights for all.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Committee and I extend a hearty welcome to all new members. Our Instructors will endeavour to teach you how to train your \log , the rest is up to you.

Please understand that all Instructors are Club members just like you, not employees. They take pleasure and pride in their task of forming you and your dog into a winning team. Most of you come to the Club just to learn how to control your dog, but somehow along the way you get the bug to compete for Certificates. The Club, therefore, trains along laid down rules and exercises and holds "Promotion Day's" for you at different levels of training.

The first is the "Beginners Certificate", very simple. Then comes the "Merit Certificate". This has just been introduced and is at par with "Encouragement Class" at trials. After that comes the "Basic Certificate", which nearly equals the "Novice Class" in trials. These three certificates are available to all members regardless if you belong to the V.C.A. (Victorian Canine Association) or not.

If you want to go further you have to join the V.C.A. For further information check with your instructor or the Office. One of the problem areas of training is the Agility Class at present. To be able to participate check with the instructor or the Office as there are certain specifications and limitations as to who is eligible.

Since our last Newsletter we had two social events, the annual Fish BBQ on Good Friday, and recently the Trivia Night. Both were well organised. A big "Thank You" to Leonie and all the helpers.

Congratulations also to all those who obtained their Club Certificates and to those who were successful on the "Trial Scene".

In closing I say "Thank You" to Colin Humphries, who resigned from the position of Training Supervisor, for having carried out this arduous and often nerve racking task organising the many classes and Instructors over the last 18 months or so. Colin remains as First Vice-President and as an Instructor.

THE KEESHOND

The **Keeshond**, a relatively rare breed in Australia, has been known in Europe for centuries. In Holland he is known as the Dutch Barge dog; in Germany as the Wolfspitz and in France as the Lou Lou or Chien Loup. In Holland the pure white **Keeshond** still holds pride of place, though the greys are well known in both countries. In France it appears only the white variety is known.

The Keeshond was first introduced into England in 1905, and in that country as well as this, only the grey Keeshond is recognised. But whatever name he goes under, or whatever colour he is, the Keeshond is known and loved for his wonderful temperament. He ranks amongst the best guard dogs available, giving plenty of warning but rarely attacking. He is unrivalled as a children's playmate, long suffering, even tempered and quite devoted to them.

The baby puppy coat needs almost daily brushing, but once the adult coat is through, a true **Keeshond** coat is easy to look after and once or twice a week brushing is sufficient to keep his coat in excellent condition. Under normal conditions a **Keeshond** has no doggy odour and the only bath advocated is after his summer moult.

Keeshonds of all ages are loving and eager to learn. The amount of their knowledge and training should be limited only by that of their owner.

In Keeshonds there is little difference in temperament between a male or female. Both are loving and loyal.



YOU AND DOG COMPETITIONS

When you acquire your first dog, your goals are usually fairly simple. Hopefully, you can learn to manage and train your new mate so it becomes a respected companion and integral family member.

As you master these basics, your ambitions become much grander. You also realise that they hold competitions for dogs. Trophies and ribbons can be won! A whole new world unfolds.

Competition is a test of your technical skills and self control. Whilst there are many "experts" keen to provide advice on your skills, only rarely does anyone bother to explain the less obvious but really important things you need to know and learn.

Everytime you compete, you must consider three main things:

your dog, other people, and yourself.

Your Dog:

You must always place your dog's safety and comfort first and the blue ribbons last.

Never allow competition to damage your friendship. It's amazing how often a much loved canine friend suddenly becomes a "stupid mongrel" just because it fails to perform in competition. If things go wrong, don't punish your dog for mistakes that were probably your fault anyway. Can you imagine how a dog must feel when it is given an unnecessarily hard time, for reasons it cannot understand, by a person it thought it could trust?

Other People: You will meet all types of people in competition. Most are pleasant and helpful, some you don't want to know and a few will be quite special. Be courteous to all, masty to none and choose your close friends carefully. Avoid the whingers and troublemakers.—Your responsibility to Officials and other competitors is to learn and observe the rules, be consistently punctual and accept decisions with good grace.

Yourself:

Make competition a personal experience. Concentrate on achieving your own personal best performance and you will have much to be proud of, regardless of the result.

Be patient with yourself. Competition teaches you many lessons about life in general but you cannot learn it all in five minutes. Try never to lose your temper. Anger directed at your dog or the people around you, is inexcusable.

When you win, treasure your moments of glory but remain humble. When you fail, be positive. You have, if nothing else, identified which aspects of your performance require more practice.

Ensure that competition is above all else — good fun. If it's not, find something else to do. Not everyone can be a great competitor so if you don't enjoy it, why bother?

Remember that true success has little to do with trophies and ribbons. It is all about how well you protect your dog, how others regard you as a person and how you feel about yourself.





TRIALLERS PLEASE NOTE

Highest Scoring Registered and Highest Scoring Associate for Year

A record must be kept of all the trials you entered this year and the relevant score. They don't have to be brilliant scores (nor qualifying) but your average is calculated and then five points for each trial is added to your average score. It could be you taking off this award if you care enough to keep records. Forms for tallying these points on are retained in the Secretary's office.

NEWSLETTER INCLUSION OF TRIAL RESULTS

All results to be published in this Newsletter must be submitted in writing to either the Secretary or myself (the Editor) stating name of trial; registered name of your dog; ordinary name of your dog; breed of dog; what class you entered in and whether you gained a place and/or a pass. Alternatively these details will be accepted by telephoning the Editor.

TITLES GAINED IN OBEDIENCE, AGILITY AND TRACKING

If you wish to receive a medallion at the Presentation Night, you must hand in details of your obedience, agility or tracking titles gained for the year to the Secretary. These results must be in writing.

For those gaining such titles, you are entitled to submit a half page resume of your dog's achievements which will be published in the Newsletter free.

THE BORZOI

(The Russian Wolfhound)

HISTORY:

The Borzoi is considered by many the most beautiful and intelligent of the 'sight hounds' - this term applies to hounds which depend on their keen vision for hunting. Highly exteemed by the nobility of Russia, originally considered disgracefull to sell, they were occasionally presented as gifts to the aristocracy of other European countries. In England great interest in the breed developed during the 1800's when a pair was given to Queen Victoria by the Russian Tzar.

APPEARANCE:

A tall elegant dog with long silky coat, can be any combination of white with black, tan, red, cream, grey or brindle.

TEMPERAMENT:

Self-composed, dignified, placid, very affectionate with his owners, and people he knows well, but aloof with strangers. Very clean and extremely easy to housetrain. Gentle with other pets, even cats, small dogs and farm animals, as long as he was brought up with them.

EXERCISE REQUIREMENT:

Fast gallop over a short distance is better than a long walk on a leash. However, being a very fast moving dog with little or no consideration for traffic, it is necessary to take him somewhere safe to run. At home he does not need a lot of space, but good fences are absolutely essential.

BORZOI AS A HOUSEPET:

Being meticulously clean, and very placid makes a Borzoi an ideal housedog.

BORZOI AND CHILDREN:

Usually very good with children, however as he has a relatively low pain tolerance, it is necessary to make sure children are not rough with him.

BORZOI AS A WATCHDOG:

Being a large dog, the Borzoi is a good deterrant for a would be intruder. However, the Borzoi is not a noisy dog, he will rarely bark without a good reason.

BORZOI IN OBEDIENCE TRAINING:

In Australia it is quite rare to use the Borzoi for obedience training, however in the USA many are gaining even the highest Obedience titles.

BORZOI AS A HUNTER:

Originally used for hunting hare, fox as well as wolf. They are still used for hunting in the USSR, USA and Australia.


