#### TRAINING YOUR DOG



#### **EQUIPMENT**

#### Voice

Your most important piece of equipment. In the early stages of training you are using your lead to teach your dog to take notice of your voice, so it is essential that you do use your voice. You need to develop three contrasting tones of voice:-

commands - firm, positive but not angry

praise - warm, happy and enthusiastic for <u>quiet</u> dogs

soft and calming for <u>boisterous</u> DOGS

scolding - sharp angry tone, only used when dog is doing

something wrong. Use 'No' rather than dog's

name.

#### Collar

Kindergarten class - you need a leather or webbing buckle collar. Other classes - usually you need a chain slip collar as sold in our club shop. It needs to be just big enough to be put on and taken off the dog without it being a struggle. Make sure it is put on the right way every time, otherwise it is continually correcting your dog even when he is working well.

For some dogs your instructor may advise using a head collar (Halti) which is a great help to people with strong or wilful dogs. It is not a muzzle.

#### Lead

Leads may be single or double, leather or webbing. Small or timid dogs do not need double leads as the double clips may disturb them. Large strong dogs are easier to control on double leads.

#### YOUR FIRST LESSON

- 1. Wear suitable clothes no thongs or scuffs, flapping skirts or long rain coats.
- 2. Be early. If you need to purchase equipment, arrive half an hour early. You need time to settle your dog before the class. Being late for your class is rude to your instructor.
- 3. Park your car considerately. Remember other people need to be able to get in and out of their vehicles.
- 4. Do not bring your dog if it is not well or if your bitch is in season. You can come yourself, if you wish, watch the class and then practise with your dog at home.
- 5. Classes are not cancelled in bad weather. It is up to you to decide if the weather is so bad that you and your dog will not profit from the class.

#### PRINCIPLES OF TRAINING

Cont...

Manoeuvre the dog into a particular position whilst giving a voice command and/or hand signal.

Reinforce this association by something pleasant - praising the dog in a warm voice and/or touching him and/or giving him food

#### TRAINING YOUR DOG (Cont..2)

and/or loosening the lead.

Discourage unwanted behaviour by withholding praise and/or using an unpleasant voice and/or by a corrective jerk of the lead.

Endeavour to understand your dog so that your levels of praise and discouragement will be suitable for your particular dog.

Emphasise the positive part of training so that your dog will work to please you rather than because he fears you.

- 6. Concentrate on your dog so that your reinforcements or discouragements are well timed. Only a fraction of a second should elapse between your dog's action and your response.
- 7. Be consistent. Use the same commands all the time for the same action. Every time you use a command make sure that the dog responds. Don 't give a command if you are not in a position to enforce it.
- 8. Make haste slowly. Consolidate each stage before going on to the next.
- 9. Practise regularly a little and often, when the dog feels lively, and end on a positive note. Choose a place with no distractions for new work then gradually increase distractions as the dog progresses with the exercise.

#### CAN YOU HELP THE CLUB?

This is now a very large club and it needs many hours of voluntary work to keep it running efficiently. If you would like to help in some way, here are some suggestions to consider:

Come to a working bee - they are usually held on Saturday's prior to a trial and there is always maintenace work to be done on the grounds.

Publicise the club - invite a neighbour to view what training and socialization has done for your dog.

Be a steward at one of our trials if you are not competing.

Offer your particular skill i.e. typing, plumbing, catering, sign writing, landscaping, carpentry etc.

Help to keep the grounds clean by putting rubbish in a bin and cleaning up after your dog.



#### A PEACEFUL FAREWELL FOR YOUR PET



Many pet owners eventually have to face having their pet euthanased, or put to sleep. While it is never an easy decision to make, euthanasia is a humane and peaceful ending for an animal who's in chronic pain, has a terminal illness or is sufferring terribly from injuries.

When is the right time to euthanase? This is a question we're often asked. If the animal is suffering from terrible injuries or a terminal illness then the decision to euthanase is usually easier and is guided by your vet. It's harder for people who own a pet who is steadily deteriorating, such as an aged pet.

If an animal is still eating and drinking, showing interest in life and still able to go to the toilet then it's worth perservering as long as you can provide the pet with its special needs. Old and debilitated animals need patience and understanding, much like elderly people. They need more supervision and general care. Once a pet's quality of life starts to fail then euthanasia can be a kind and peaceful ending to a long and happy life. Your veterinarian can help advise you about the right time to euthanase your pet.

Euthanasia is performed by giving an injection of very concentrated anaesthetic into the vein. It is painless and rapid; the animal dies within a couple of minutes. Occasionally, for up to 30 minutes after death, animals will make a gasping action or their muscles might twitch. It's also common for the bladder or bowels to empty. The eyes stay open which gives the animal a starey appearance and the body stays warm for about an hour before rigor mortis starts to set in and the body stiffens.

There are several options in disposing of your pet's body. If possible you might like to bury your pet at home or maybe on a friend's property if it can be arranged. There are also pet burial and cremation services available. Alternatively, your vet can arrange disposal of the body which usually involves a mass burial with other dead domestic animals. If you are considering having your pet euthanased then discuss the options with your vet. Some people prefer euthanasia to be performed at home so that the pet is in familiar surroundings. This can usually be arranged. A nurse will often accompany the vet to assist.

It's normal for people to mourn the loss of a pet. Grief is a normal reaction to the loss of something we love. People need not feel ashamed or embarrassed if they mourn the loss of a pet. The support and understanding of family and friends during this time is important and the people at your veterinary practice are always willing to help in any way they can as you come to terms with the loss of a friend.

#### LOOKING AFTER YOUR PET'S TEETH

There's been some confusion amongst pet owners lately as a result of some stories in the press, about feeding processed pet foods and it's relationship to dental disease.

Processed pet foods, both canned and dry, provide a nutritionally balanced diet for your pets and are convenient and economical. They need to be supplemented however, with either raw bones or rawhide chewbones at least once a week.

Dental problems, such as tartar, gum disease and root infections, arise when cats and dogs don't exercise their teeth and gums through chewing. Tinned food in particular requires little chewing and so dogs and cats who are fed nothing else are the ones we're most likely to see with dental disease.

Gum and mouth infections are also believed to be two of the many causes of other more serious diseases such as kidney infections, throat infections, bronchitis and blood infections. Looking after your pet's teeth is looking after your pet's health.

Some dogs and cats (especially little fussy eaters!) won't chew the raw bones and rawhide chews you provide. If this happens you need to think about brushing your pet's teeth! As funny as it sounds to some people initially, it is a good idea and protects your pet's health (and saves you money!) in the longer term. There is a whole range of pet teeth cleaning agents available now from toothbrushes, toothpastes, dental wipes, floss bones and flavoured chew toys. It's important not to use human toothpaste as it can cause gastric upsets in dogs and cats.

Train your pet to have its teeth cleaned by playing with its mouth from an early age and gently introducing the toothbrush to brush the teeth, always rewarding your pet with praise and the odd food treat.


