



By now you may have realized that there is more to it than walking the dog, but stick with it. Ten to fifteen minutes daily works wonders. It is all you need as long as you make it a brisk but enjoyable session with a reward at the end of it.

While being a member please adhere to the rules of which you were informed in print, and also at the Induction morning. It makes it a lot easier for everyone. From time to time your instructor may remind the class if the need arises over any issues.

On 21 July 1996 Winston and I finally achieved the Companion Dog Title.

We started obedience training when Winston was 5 months old and after obtaining our Club Certificates we were finally able to enter the wonderful world of Trialing.



SNACK ATTACK....

Bluey's Broth
2 lamb shanks
1 cup barley
1 grated potato
2 beef cubes
1 chopped onion (optional)
1 cup chopped cabbage
1 cup freshly shelled peas

½ cup grated pumpkin

Cover shanks with water, bring to the boil, pour off water and start again. This process removes grit and any other impurities from the meat. Add barley and simmer for 20 mins. before stirring in the vegies. and cooking for a further 20 minutes. Remove shanks, strip meat and add to soup. Cool before serving, and possibly pour over dried food.

Mongrel Meat Medley
2 lamb flaps/neck of lamb
3/4 cup barley
1 ox heart
1 pinch of herbs

Put all ingredients in a saucepan and barely cover with water. Make sure lid is on, to suppress the odour given off whilst cooking, then simmer for 30 minutes gently.
