
Today, after training, we will be "displaying" at Christ the King School fete, so if any members want to come along and lend support you will be most welcome! 1.00 p.m. is the time.



The Club has purchased a computer so we are now fully computerized and it should make the workload for the secretary and treasurer a bit easier and for future committee members.


