



AGILITY CLASSES


The Club offers Agility Classes each Sunday morning for dogs that have gained their Merit Certificate.

There is a series of four Classes through which you and your dog proceed, beginning with the Foundation Class and moving through Beginners, Intermediate and Advanced. Should you be interested in Trialing after this, there are two sessions offered on Monday evenings with more of a self-help and peer support format

New classes are beginning in 1st term, 2008, so if you and your dog would like to join in, make sure you get a form from the Office or the Agility Instructors, ask your Instructor to sign it for you so we know your dog is under control off lead, and hand it back to the Office or one of the Agility Instructors.

Agility is a lot of fun – just ask anyone who is already hooked!

CANINE ANATOMY



READING DOG BODY LANGUAGE

Sent in by Wendy Ganly

This dog is under extreme stress.

Looking to handler for reassurance.

Ears back and down, pinned flat against neck. Wide open mouth, lips drawn back, rapid respiration.

Center of gravity forward, shoulders lowered, hunched forward. Tail tucked, tension in haunches, probably trembling.

How to greet this dog: Stand sideways, using calming signals - yawn, deep sigh, pick at the floor (imitates sniffing) will help her relax and feel safer.

Avoid stroking and cooing "it's ok, it's alright." Excess adrenalin results in suppressed appetite; the dog will be able to take food when her stress level comes down.




Calming signals, appeasement

Body curved in C-shape. Head lowered and turned away, nose down. Ears lowered but relaxed. Tenseness over eyebrows. Eyes squinted but soft, blinking

Lips soft. Nose, lip lick. Body weight shifted, paw probably raised

This dog is trying to appear as non-threatening as possible, his goal is to diffuse any aggression from approaching person or animal in a totally passive way. By using appropriate body language and calming signals, you could easily let this dog know that you are non-threatening and ease his tension. Don't loom, hover or stare. Get low, turn sideways, use soft eye and quiet voice.



READING DOG BODY LANGUAGE continued.

Avoidance - aggressive response likely if approached too quickly or cornered.

Dog is in C-shape, looking away, but head is lifted slightly, pupils dilated in a frozen stare, watching with peripheral vision.

Center of gravity is toward oncoming"threat"

Ears back and lowered, tail low.

Lips are forward and in tense line.

Tenseness over muzzle, whiskers erect.

Tenseness in the haunches.

"Frozen" defense (freeze, fight or flight)

While this dog is not looking for a fight, it is likely that if reached for suddenly, it would react in self defense with a rapid, probably inhibited, series of fast bites



Note: this dog is not looking to a person for reassurance, he's looking at the wall – trying to be invisible.

Nose up, ears back.

Whale eye stare.

Lips drawn back. (fear)

Flight would be his first choice, but he is cornered by being on leash and against a wall.


This pup has also flattened himself against the wall, this time in a more actively self-defensive posture.


Ears back, whale eye, focused on person holding his leash.


Lips are tight, whiskers forward.

Tail is up, not tucked - he is probably just as stressed but is more confident/aroused than the previous pup.

The previous pup would probably hurt HIMSELF trying to get away, this pup might hurt YOU.








READING DOG BODY LANGUAGE continued.

Beware the cornered dog. You must always leave an escape route.




Pup A. Head is lowered, whale eye, ears back. Backed into corner, lips tight and forward. Shoulders lowered, weight shifted to left, looking for escape route.

Pup B.

Chin up, pupils dilated. Ears back & down, tightness over muzzle, lips forward, whiskers erect. Backed into a corner, legs braced. Direct stare, prepared defend self. Which is more likely bite?

Both of these pups are stressed, fearful and willing to defend themselves if pressed. Pup B is probably most prepared to bite at this moment.





Similar, and yet so different. Dog at right is telling you with his eyes exactly where he intends to bite.

READING DOG BODY LANGUAGE continued.

Response to looming and staring.



A. Direct eye contact -could growl if feels challenged. B. Big calming signal - appeasing nose lick.

Relaxed, confident and well-socialized



Lips, ears, facial muscles, eyes are relaxed, respiration normal.

SIGNS TO LOOK FOR WHEN CHECKING YOUR DOG'S WEIGHT



- Ribs, lumbar vertebrae, and pelvic bones easily visible
- No palpable fat
- Obvious waist and abdominal tuck
- Prominent pelvic bones



- Ribs easily palpable
- Minimal fat covering
- Waist easily noted when viewed from above
- Abdominal tuck evident



- Ribs palpable, but not visible
- Waist observed behind ribs when viewed from above
- Abdomen tucked up when viewed from side



- Ribs palpable with slight excess of fat covering
- Waist discernible when viewed from above, but not prominent
- Abdomina! tuck apparent



- Ribs not easily palpable under a heavy fation covering
- Fat deposits over lumbar area and tait base
- Waist barely visible to absent
- No abdominal tuck may exhibit obvious abdominal distantion.

AGILITY WEEKEND

Great weather, great accommodation, great camaraderie and the most picturesque setting imaginable — what more could you want from a weekend's agility trials?

This was what was ahead of us when eleven Geelong Obedience Club members set off for the three-day NADAC Nationals, held this year at Neerim East. As usual, we were laden to the hilt with gear for our dogs and ourselves so it was a relief to be able to unpack and leave everything set



up for the three days. We managed to find good spots for the tents near the ring, close to shade trees and close to the creek for those dogs that liked to cool off in it. The ground was part of a natural amphitheatre and covered in lush green grass. Perfect!

Over the three days we participated in sixteen events, covering such things as Regular agility, Jumpers, Hoopers, Weavers, Touch N Go, Chances and Tunnelers, but we also had the opportunity to form teams of three dogs and compete in a team event each day. Geelong Members acquitted themselves well and brought home lots of qualies and rosettes for their efforts.

As well as the two international judges from America and Canada we were very fortunate to have three others on their team to advise and support us too. At no other agility trial have I experienced the help given to us by these five wonderful people. There was a mini seminar scheduled for the Friday night, but on Saturday afternoon the Trial was stopped for twenty minutes or so and another impromptu, but very relevant, explanation/demonstration was also given.

They taught us so much, and in reply, we tried to further their education re Australian slang and colloquialisms. Some expressions they had learned from the internet and some of their American equivalents were just too inappropriate!

Throughout the three days there were many individual highlights and personal bests but the prevailing atmosphere of fun and friendship was what made the Nationals the special event it was.






