

Cooking for your dog

Fish A LA Fifi

200g frozen fish fillet 200g short grain rice 1 Leek 1 Hard boiled egg 2 tomatoes diced 1 tablespoon olive oil

Defrost the fish fillet, cook the rice with 2 cups of water until almost mushy. Remove from the stove.

Clean the leek, halve it lengthways, wash thoroughly and cut into very thin strips. Peel the egg and chop finely.

Fry the fish in Olive oil on both sides. Add leek and tomatoes and fry with fish for further 5 minutes.

Remove from the heat, break up the fish with a fork, add rice and egg, mix well. Allow to cool slightly before feeding.
This makes a number of portions.
