

Branko and I have been hitting the streets of Geelong, Bendigo, Morwell, Ballarat and Cranbourne working our way through tests 4 to 10 in Track and Search.

I am pleased and proud with my boy as he took to this style of tracking with ease.

At the start of a track the judge gives me a bag which I would open and give Branko a sniff, and then we were off in search of our lost track layer. As we progressed the length of cooking time of a track increased up to 4 hours, so we had some waiting time while this occurred. We also had pauses on the tracks and the last two, the track layer had a ride in a car for a short section. Test 6, 8, and 10 were all conducted in the dark.

So together with Kuyan am pleased to say they are the first two Victorian Dobermanns to obtain their RE Titles.

Piper obtained her CCD Title at Ballaarat and I've even had a previous Dobermann get his Championship Title there and win a BEST IN SHOW at the same time (all breeds). So this goldrush town certainly gives us our own rush!

Piper has now retired from formal competition and just continues her monthly nursing home visits, whilst her mate continues to do his weekly visits and obtain treats from their many friends there. Considering in April due to ill health I was unsure I'd make it back into a competitive ring, am proud of my duo for making it easier for me to get there again. – **Elaine Longshaw**

Dog Biscuit Recipe

Ingredients

Serves: 18

2 cups (250g) wholemeal flour

1 tablespoon baking powder

270g unsalted natural peanut butter

1 cup (250ml) low fat milk

Method

Preheat the oven to 190 degrees C. Grease

trays. Stir together the flour and baking powder and

set aside.

In a medium bowl, mix together the peanut butter

and milk. Stir in the flour mixture until well blended.

Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface and knead until smooth. Roll out to 1cm

thickness and cut into shapes using biscuit cutters.

Place 2cm apart on the prepared baking trays.

Bake for 20 minutes or until lightly brown. Remove from baking trays to cool on wire rack

KAREN DAMIANI – CHAOS TO CALM

On Saturday a group of dog owners benefited greatly from a workshop hosted by Karen Damiani. This is called Chaos to Calm. The workshop is a half day focused on teaching owners how to calm their overstimulated dogs. Karen has worked for years in rehabilitating shelter dogs and has worked out strategies for teaching pet dog owners how to reconnect with their overly excitable dogs.

Currently these workshops are held at Boroondara Dog Training in Melbourne but can be booked for clubs and members.

Exercises were for dog that went over the top when overstimulated by something n the environment.

These exercises would be a great benefit to all instructors to start their classes with.

The impression I got was that the dog who overstimulated by the environment in some way, was to be taught a series of exercises to do, which require concentrating on the sequence. This in turn lowered the excitement level due to its sheer repetition.

Also you are trying to create a bubble for the dog and not let other dogs into this space.

We worked on:-

Add a sound Bridge. ("good" being more calming than the usual "yes" for the overstimulated dog).

Exercises

- 1 Count of three with backward and forward arm/hand movement for each count, and release treat to fall on dog at count of three.
- 2 Move a few steps in three different directions. Repeat sequence
- Ask for a "Sit" say "good" and pay. Extend the still sitting moment by adding extra "Goods" before treating.
- Add a distraction like a soft toy with squeaker. Get someone to operate the toy. When dog looks at the toy say "End" and walk away.
 - Repeat till ignoring all distractions.
 - Note *Compliant is NOT calm.
- Massage. All over moving muscles under the skin. Get a rhythm going and rick the dog with the movement. Let the dog get up when he wants too. Work up a sweat doing this. Remember to squash up the ears and face. (reminder when resting don't touch or feed, just let the brain rest).
- 6 Step forward as soon as the dog focuses forward/moves forward, stop, say "end" and back up and turn away in a largish circle so that you are not correcting the dog with the lead.
 - (the default behaviour you are looking for is See dog move to owner). You are creating a safety umbrella for the dog. Do not ever let other dogs into that safety area.

Hope this may be of interest to members.

• R. Linford raised concerns about the general running of the Club and the need to document what we do as an organisation.


ACTION: The Committee to begin the review process of the Club's operating procedures.
